



## From Scholarship Recipient to Physician . . . Jackie Gould Becomes Hospitalist

**Jackie Gould, M.D.** and Hospitalist for Longmont United Hospital, attributes the scholarships she received from the Longmont United Hospital Foundation in 1994 and 1995, as being an important part of her journey into the medical field. She received her BSN from Regis University in 1995 and graduated from the University of Colorado School of Medicine in 2005: "I love practicing medicine in Longmont and I am very grateful for the assistance I received from the Foundation. At that time I had three young children, was working part-time, and attending school full-time. My scholarship through the Foundation eased the financial burden and enabled me to complete my BSN. It also helped me pursue my dream of becoming a physician. I've always been intrigued with primary care because I love the variety, and the unique interaction with patients involved with this type of practice."

The Hospitalists group consists of 5 physicians, and 3 mid-level providers (1 Physicians' Assistant, and 2 Nurse Practitioners) who work together to provide services at Longmont United Hospital. The Hospitalist Program was instituted last summer. It reflects a nationwide trend of having in-house physicians to ease the time constraints of a patient's regular physician. This allows the physicians to schedule more patient hours in their offices without having to juggle hospital visits. All the Hospitalists at Longmont United Hospital are board certified in Family Medicine. They have regular contact with patients' local primary care physicians, and in some cases are able to access a patient's complete medical record. This allows for an almost seamless continuum of care. The Hospitalists consult with specialists and rely heavily on them to treat patients requiring their services. Patient treatment information is dictated to the patient chart and is available electronically to the primary care physician at all times.

Jackie loves working at Longmont United Hospital and is grateful for the support she receives from the administration, clinical staff and the physicians. "I'm thankful for the guidance Dr. Van Hook and Dr. Tangel provide to the Hospitalists as our Medical Directors. They are wonderful liaisons and are always readily available. I feel Longmont United Hospital is a perfect sized facility for me and allows me to experience a wide range of medical situations and opportunities in a personalized, friendly environment. All physicians are faced with ever increasing and changing regulations and they are one of the biggest challenges we face in providing good patient care. 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## Longmont United Hospital Foundation Scholarship/Loan Applications Available

The Longmont United Hospital Foundation offers a merit-based scholarship/loan program to encourage students to pursue educational opportunities for careers in the healthcare field. *Pick up applications at the Foundation Office located one block east of the hospital in the Summertree Building, 1380 Tulip Street, Suite A.*

Awards are given for tuition assistance only. (i.e. funds may not be used for room & board or books)

The Foundation's goal is to award applicants who will choose to pursue a career with Longmont United Hospital. Upon completion of their education, students who are offered employment at Longmont United Hospital will have their loan forgiven upon the completion of a service requirement. A summary of repayment provisions is in the application. All applications must be submitted by March 31, 2009.

Scholarship funds will not be awarded for any pre-requisite course work. You must be accepted or enrolled in the healthcare program in your field of study and all pre-requisite course work must be completed before any scholarship funds are disbursed. Simply "majoring" in a healthcare field at an institution does not necessarily qualify for scholarship/loan assistance. Applicants should inquire with the Foundation staff before they complete the application, if they are unsure how this requirement will affect their eligibility. ### *Giving Through Your Estate*

Benefits from IRAs and Pension Funds - Your Estate can save both income taxes and estate taxes if you make Longmont United Hospital Foundation the death beneficiary of your individual retirement account or other retirement savings plan.
